Praise **Father, Son**, and **Holy Ghost**.

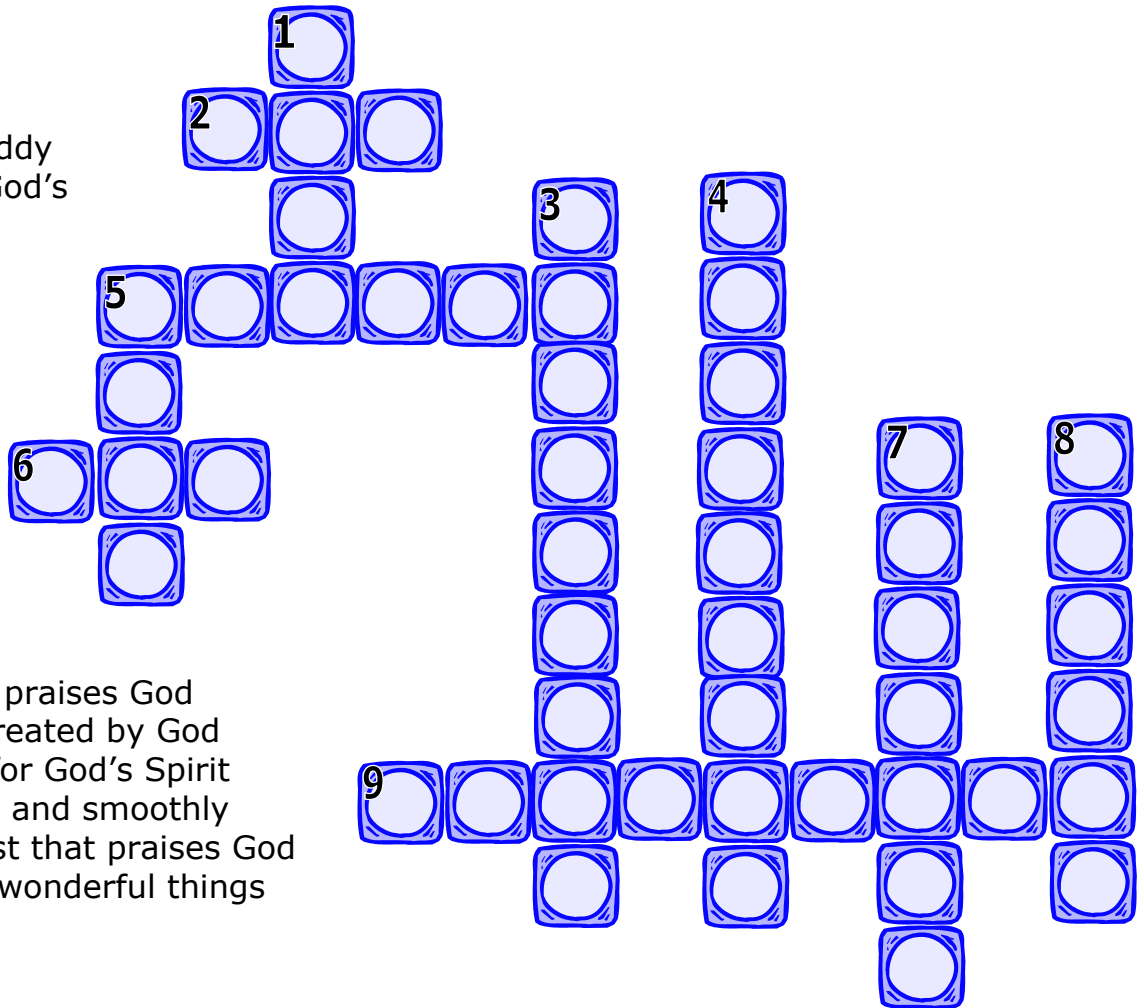
This is called a "doxology" because it praises God. The word "doxology" comes from the Greek word "doxa" which means "glory."

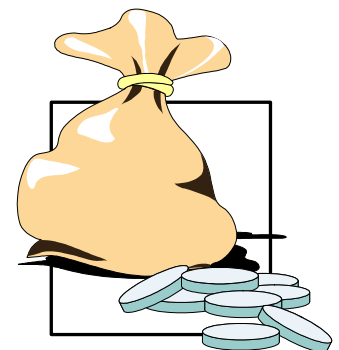
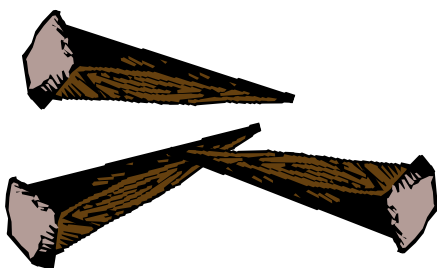
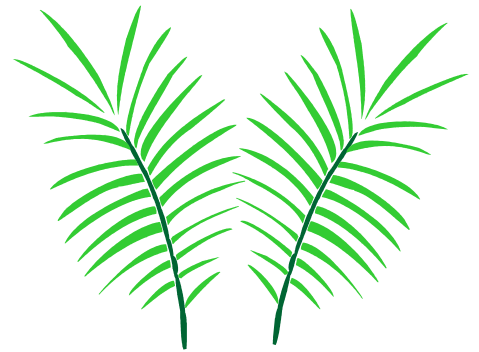
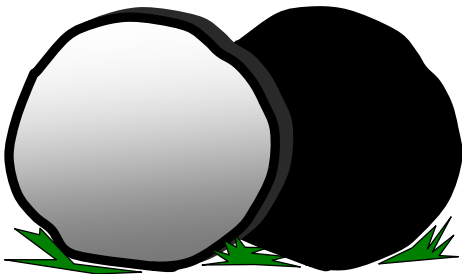


Taking My Place

Can you see a situation through someone else's eyes? Jesus showed us how to trade places! He took our place on the cross and died for our sins so we can have an abundant life, and live with Him forever when we die.

We have many symbols to remind us of the events that led to Jesus' crucifixion and resurrection. **Palm branches** were waved on Palm Sunday. The **bread** and **cup** remind us of the Last Supper. Judas betrayed Jesus for thirty silver **coins**. A **crown of thorns** was placed on Jesus' head. The **nails** and the **cross** remind us of the crucifixion, and an **empty tomb** recalls the resurrection.


mystery melody

A mystery melody is coded in the colored rulers! Use both the LENGTH CODE and COLOR CODE to write the correct note on the MYSTERY MELODY staff above each colored ruler.

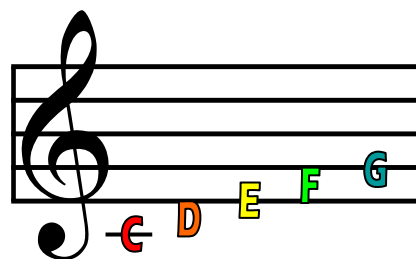
LENGTH CODE: The **length** of the ruler tells how long the pitch is. The length tells whether to write a quarter note, a half note, or a whole note.

COLOR CODE: The **color** of the ruler tells the pitch of the note. The color tells whether to write the note on the staff as a C, D, E, F or G.

One-inch ruler  = quarter note: ♩ (1 beat)

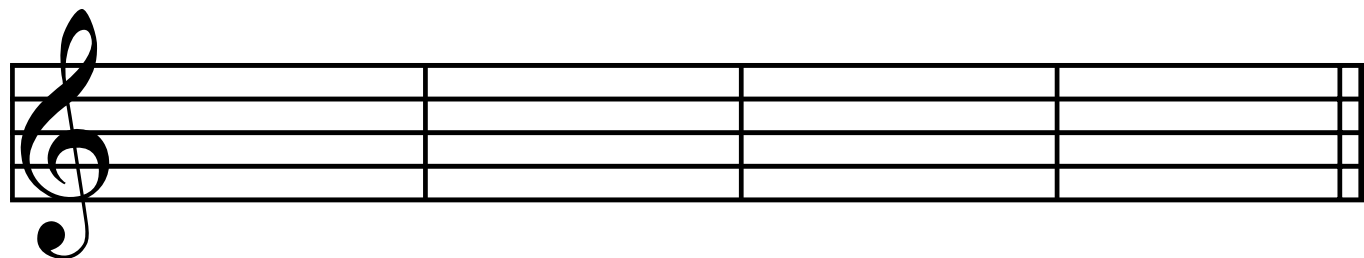
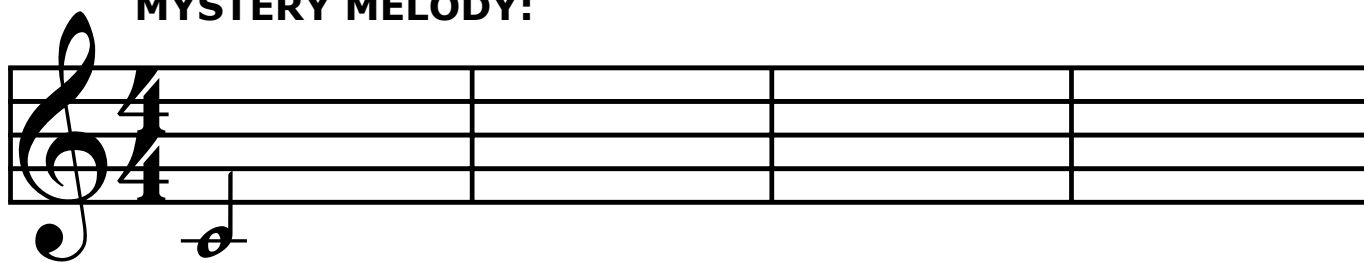
Two-inch ruler  = half note: ♪ (2 beats)

Four-inch ruler  = whole note: ♩ (4 beats)








The first note is an example. A half note ♪ is the length, because the ruler is two inches. C is the pitch because the ruler is red.

























A Note-worthy Worker!

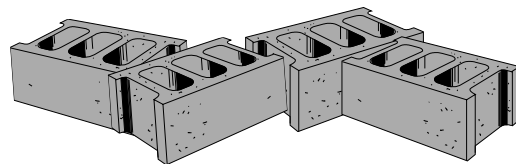


-  A quarter note = **one** beat
-  A quarter rest = **one** beat
-  A half note = **two** beats
-  A dotted half = **three** beats
-  A whole note = **four** beats
