

FAMILY DRAMA

(in 3 parts)

Theme: Marriage/Family

Scripture References: Colossians 3:1; Ephesians 5:25 ; Proverbs 31:10 –12; Proverbs 15:1; Ephesians 4:32

Characters: four (Wife, husband, daughter narrator/worship leader)

Tone: Light

Synopsis: Capitalizing on a popular credit card ad, each short drama asks the question, “What value do I put on my family relationships.” Each part can be used separately to set up a sermon on family.

Running Time: 30 seconds each

Set: chair
desk

Props: newspaper
dress with price tags still attached
oven mittens
charred casserole dish
blouse with large stain

PART 1

(Husband at center reading the paper)(Enter Wife wearing a new outfit)

WIFE: Honey, does this outfit make me look fat?

HUSBAND: *(looks up from paper and looks at the audience)*

PART 2

(Wife enters from a long day's work) (enter Husband from opposite wearing oven mittens and carrying a burned casserole dish)

HUSBAND: Look honey, I made dinner for us!

PART 3

(Mom is on stage when daughter enters carrying a house with a large stain)

DAUGHTER: Mommy, I spilled my juice, but I wiped it up with this.
